Churchyard Care

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard, which is lovingly cared for by our volunteers, paid grounds-team, and those who tend the graves of their loved ones. David, Anne and Travers (the Churchyard Care Team) have recently designed information leaflets, to help people to apply for headstones, reserve burial plots, and place memorial benches. We are also designing signs which

will shortly be put up around the churchyard. These things also explain the laws regarding what is allowed to be placed on graves in churchyards in this Diocese. There are currently many items in our churchyard which are not allowed under the law (e.g. borders, loose stones, vases, pots, ornaments, tablets, etc.). We will very soon be sending the new leaflet "The Churchyard Code" to those for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items which are not allowed under the law. Getting the balance right between caring for our grieving families, and upholding the law so that what happens is fair and safe for everyone, is a sensitive and demanding task, as well as being a huge piece of work, and one for which we will, no doubt, be criticised on social media; so please pray for our Churchyard Care Team.

Thought for the Month by Revd David Cattle:

Good and Bad Leaders

It's the start of the new year! I've been reflecting on Psalm 72, which is one of the readings set for Epiphany. It fits with Epiphany because it talks about other nations coming to pay tribute to the true king of the Jews, which is what the Wise Men did for Jesus.

Psalm 72 talks about the king of Israel. If we translate that into our culture, it says 3 things about God's views on leadership - (1) how a leaders should behave, (2) how we should pray for leaders, and (3) how we should respond to leaders.

How should leaders behave? By being people who bring about justice for everyone – there are no favourites, no-one is above the law, everyone has access to justice, and society is fair. And by protecting the vulnerable, rather than letting the powerful oppress the powerless. We know why leaders are tempted to automatically side with the powerful – their voices and their influence are bigger – but this is a sin which should be resisted.

Good leaders should also bring prosperity, be acknowledged by other nations, and have a long-lasting legacy, but the Psalm indicates that they first need to concentrate on bringing justice and protecting the vulnerable, and these other things will take care of themselves.

How should we pray for leaders? That they should be people of justice and righteousness. It's OK to pray for prosperity, respect on the world stage, and a good legacy, but we need to pray for leaders to focus on justice and righteousness first.

How should we respond to leaders? I'm thinking specifically, what should we do if our leaders turn out to be bad leaders? It would be easy to allow them to lead us astray, but we must resist this. If our leaders don't care about justice and truth, we must care even more. If they don't care about the vulnerable, then we must do so even more. If they are greedy, we must be generous. If they treat people with disrespect, we should be work hard at being respectful. If they write off and belittle others, we should recognise the integrity of others and seek blessings for them. If they are aggressive, we should be gentle. Etc.

The Old Testament contains such wisdom. It comes from a very different context to our own, but God speaks through it. Please do read the Old Testament!

At the end of the Psalm, it calls us to praise God: "Praise be to the LORD God of Israel, who alone does marvellous deeds. Praise to his glorious name for ever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory. Amen and amen!"
