

Thought for the Month by Revd David Cattle:

Let's Build the House!

I recently spent a few days on retreat at Crowhurst Christian Healing Centre in Sussex. The retreat was led by the chaplains there, and the theme was "The Minor Prophets".

We don't often read the so-called Minor Prophets. They are twelve books right at the end of the Old Testament. They are called "minor" because they are shorter than other prophetic books in the Old Testament, like Isaiah and Jeremiah, not because they are less important. In fact, they are very important.

I spent some time reflecting on the book of Haggai. Go on, read it for yourself! It's very short and really good. The context is that the Jewish people have come home from exile in Babylon, and they are rebuilding their nation and their religious life. But God is not pleased with them. This is because they have put time into building their own houses while the house of God, the Temple, still lies in ruins. This situation means that their national life is not quite working properly, and God thinks their worship is unclean. So, God wants them to get their act together and rebuild the Temple. God encourages the people to do this, saying that they need not fear to do this job because he is with them, he abides among them, he is committed to them (as per his covenant with his chosen people), and he is sovereign over the whole earth. And he says that if they start to build, he will fill the house with good things, and the glory of the house will be greater than it ever was, and then the nation will have prosperity! The book is from a particular time and context, but it applies to all time and any context, because it shows us two things: (1) what humans are like (even the best of us are tempted to put our own comfort and protection before worshipping and serving God) and (2) what God is like (he desires a deeper relationship with us and he wants to bless us).

What should we (you and me) do? We should rebuild God's house. This applies to us as a Church and to us as individuals. As a Church, we should attend to the Spirit of God living amongst us, and we should prioritise worship with others in Church on Sunday mornings. As individuals, we should attend to the Spirit of God living within us, we should never neglect our own devotional life of prayer and Bible reading, and we should constantly strive for a deeper relationship with God.

If we do this work of building, God will be our committed, faithful, covenant partner in the work. Our relationship with him (as individuals and as a Church family) will be better than it has ever been, and God will bless us.

This summer and always, let's build the house! God bless, David.
