#### **Churchyard Care**

We are so fortunate to have a beautiful churchyard, which is lovingly cared for by our volunteers, paid grounds-team, and those who tend the graves of their loved ones. David, Anne and Travers (the Churchyard Care Team) have recently designed information leaflets, to help people to apply for headstones, reserve burial plots, and place memorial benches. We are also designing signs which will shortly be put up around the churchyard. These things also explain the laws regarding what is allowed to be placed on graves in churchyards in this Diocese. There are currently many items in our churchyard which are not allowed under the law (e.g. borders, loose stones, vases, pots, ornaments, tablets, etc.). We will very soon be sending the new leaflet "The Churchyard Code" to those for whom we have contact details, and we will encourage people to remove those items which are not allowed under the law. Getting the balance right between caring for our grieving families, and upholding the law so that what happens is fair and safe for everyone, is a sensitive and demanding task, as well as being a huge piece of work, and one for which we will, no doubt, be criticised on social media; so please pray for our Churchyard Care Team.

#### **Thought for the Month by Travers Harpur:**

"Falling Buildings"



I am writing (November 2025) at the time of a visit to Novi Sad, Serbia where a station canopy collapsed a year ago killing 16 people. This month there have been demonstrations against the Serbian government relating to the collapse.

Nearly 2000 years ago Jesus said (Luke 13:4/5) "....Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish."

Whether it is 1<sup>st</sup> Century Jerusalem, 21<sup>st</sup> Century Serbia or some tragedy in our life we often ask why did it happen, who was at fault? Sometimes it remains a mystery, sometimes there is a clear culprit, be it a corrupt builder, a negligent designer or penny-pinching implementation. There may be contributing factors, wind, earthquake, rain. When bad things happen to us we wonder what did we do wrong; sometimes there is a link and at others none. Jesus clearly didn't think the people on whom the tower fell were more guilty and in the case of the man born blind:

John 9: "As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"" Jesus replied, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him."" The first part is clear, but the sting is in the tail.

The demonstrators in Novi Sad blame the government. I seek to answer, "why me', what did I do?" all my attention on me or sometimes 'us'. But in John 9 the message was about God. There is a problem of suffering linked to a loving God. There is a full session on this subject in 'Know Why You Believe' next year but meanwhile I need to alter my balance and stop forgetting that there is a 'God side' to the issue.
