Thought for the Month by Fiona Selden:

Thomas was one of Jesus' twelve disciples who got stuck with the label 'Doubting Thomas'. But is this fair? Who is Thomas? Thomas Didymus, the twin; he is one of two – there is another like him? Truth to tell, there are many like him. Can we see something of ourselves in Thomas?

When the risen Jesus first appears to the disciples – Thomas is not there. Why, and why is he so reluctant to believe the other disciples when they say they have met the risen Christ? Perhaps Thomas was so deeply wounded by Jesus' death that he cut himself off from the others in his grief. Now he is afraid to believe; surely it is too good to be true. Thomas stands with those who are afraid today; those who've been badly let down and wounded by life. And Jesus meets such as these with compassion, gentleness and understanding. Jesus understood what Thomas needed; what would ease his fear.

Thomas was an active questioner, a seeker. At the Last Supper when Jesus says he is going to prepare a place for his friends, Thomas says, "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" Lord, if you don't give me the destination, how can I sort out a route? I need the address, Lord! Thomas has the honesty and integrity to ask Jesus the question that perhaps was in the other disciples' minds, but which they didn't have the courage to voice. Jesus encourages us all to ask questions, to seek him out ourselves – ask, seek, knock.

A week after making his sceptical response Thomas is there with the other disciples when Jesus appears again. Do we see in the fact of Thomas' presence a stubborn faith? He's not quite sure what he believes, but he's still there. The deep-rooted fact of his faith is still there. And when Thomas does encounter the risen Christ, look at his response: "My Lord and my God". "Doubting Thomas" utters this clearest affirmation of the divinity of Christ that any of the apostles ever gave before Pentecost. And what happened to him after this? Church tradition tells us that he preached in ancient Babylon and Persia, present-day Iraq and Iran, and continued to win disciples to the Christian faith. Then he sailed south to Malabar on the west coast of India in 52 AD. He preached and established churches there. When the Portuguese landed in India in the early 1600s, they found a group of Christians there -- the Mar Thoma Church, established through Thomas' preaching a millennium and a half before. Thomas speaks to those who want their faith to make a difference; those who want others to encounter and know the risen Jesus.

The wounded...the questioners...the unsure...the zealous...Thomas' experience speaks to us all...Thomas is a bit of an Everyman figure. We can all identify with him.
