The Churchyard Code

Anne, Travers and David have just written to all those whose loved ones are buried or remembered in our churchyard, to send them a copy of the latest version of our leaflet "The Churchyard Code" which summarises the rules of the churchyard. These rules are set by the Diocese, and are part of English law. We are aware that there are many items currently on graves which are not allowed to be there, so we are having a Spring Tidy-Up in the churchyard, and we are asking everyone to read the new leaflet carefully and then to remove any items which are not allowed. It is important that we do move towards complying with the law, over time, out of respect for the people and the place.

We know that different people grieve in different ways, and that removing cherished items from a grave can be hard. How Long?

Most of us don't like waiting – it can be something ordinary like waiting for a bus or a train, or getting an important letter in the post which hadn't come even though it was sent by first class, or more importantly waiting for an urgent appointment at the hospital, or even waiting for answers to our prayers.

8th May is the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War in Europe – we will be celebrating this in our country on 5th May. There were great celebrations in London in 1945. Travers' father came all the way up from Bristol to be there. It was 5 long years for Hitler to be defeated. Some people would have been sad that their loved ones had died in combat or through bombing. The cost of rebuilding the war damage was enormous and food rationing went on for several years. In Germany there were so many displaced people with nowhere to go, others fleeing from Stalin, and the few Jews still alive were not welcomed back into their homes in Poland.

Many of the East European countries were under an Iron Curtain. This wouldn't be removed until after the Berlin wall came down in 1989 – a long time for all those people, but an amazing ministry

Ukraine regained its independence soon after that. How sad then that Putin invaded 3+ years ago! How long are they going to have to wait as they continue to see the loss of homes and businesses, families divided, soldiers killed and maimed, civilians killed, the cost of basic food increasing, etc? But there have been answers to prayer in all this and people have been finding Jesus through different ministries.

The chorus of one of Stuart Townend's hymns (MP 1014) is very apt:

"How long before You drench the barren land? How long before we see Your righteous hand? How long before Your name is lifted high? How long before the weeping turns to joy?"

So are these verses from Lamentations 3 which Jeremiah was inspired to write after the Fall of Jerusalem:

"The Lord is good to those who hope in Him; to the one who seeks Him; it is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord." (vs 25,26)

"For men are not cast off by the Lord for ever. Though He brings grief, He will show compassion, so great is His unfailing love. For He does not willingly bring affliction or grief to the children of men." (vs 31-33)
