Thought for the Month by Jane Harpur

How do you feel at the start of November? The clocks have gone back and the curtains are drawn earlier because of the increasing darkness as the month proceeds and all the Christmas lights have still to arrive. The beautiful shades of autumn are disappearing, but all the fallen leaves have to be raked up. It is also a time for remembering – "Remember, remember the 5th of November, Gunpowder, treason and plot!" An old saying which I used to say as a child-I have never liked the sudden loud bangs of fireworks and I am glad the animals share my feelings but of course we also remember on the 11th those who died in the first and second world wars plus the wars since then and those still going on.

But November 1st is All Saints Day. When people used to come round the houses asking for trick or treat on Halloween, I used to say I don't celebrate that pagan festival, I remember All Saint's Day and they look at me in amazement. Who are the Saints- those with names like the apostles or those who have been martyred for their faith like St Catherine who was tied to a spiked wheel to be tortured and killed but it broke when she touched it; she was beheaded instead. Catherine wheels which are used on fireworks night are called after her. Now all of us who have been made holy through believing in Jesus and cleansed by the blood of the Lamb. In Paul's letters to the churches he often calls the believers there 'saints'.

Let us remember the many saints who helped us in our Christian lives. We will all be singing together in Heaven. We will also be with those Old Testament people of Faith mentioned in Hebrews 11- they would be made perfect together with us because of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Jesus said to the thief on the cross today you will be with Me in Paradise. Perhaps the thief was the first believer to meet the Old Testament saints.
