Our Beautiful Churchyard

We are privileged to have a wonderful churchyard here at St Michael's, which Anne, Chris and our volunteer team work so hard to maintain as a place of beauty, peace and connection with God. The churchyard has rules which are set by the Diocese and are part of English law setting out what is allowed to be left on graves.

The Churchyard Care Team (Anne, Travers and David) are in the process of writing a new policy for how we administer the churchyard law, and this will set out how we deal with items on graves that are not allowed to be there. Once the policy is finalised, we will begin a project to publicise the rules more fully, and then we will write to families to ask that unlawful items be removed from graves.

We aim to get the balance right between two very important things: caring for our families and helping them to remember their loved ones, and upholding the law. This is not an easy thing to get right, so we ask for prayer for wisdom as we care for our churchyard and all its users. More information will be available shortly. Thought for the Month by Revd David Cattle:

Happy Birthday!

Our Church building was consecrated on the Festival of Michael and All Angels, 29 September 1873, which means that this month we turn 150! We are having lots of special events to celebrate, and you will find more details on the inside pages. But what's the point of this? Beyond our instinctive desire to mark a big number, why should we celebrate this milestone in the Church's life?

One reason that occurs to me is this: We celebrate the birthday of a person because it is a way of saying that that person matters – their life is important, we value who they are and the life that they live, and we love them. It's the day in the year when they are reminded that they are loved.

Many people don't like to celebrate their own birthday – they might find it a bit selfindulgent, and it might raise a variety of guilty feelings. But I think it is important to celebrate our own birthday – we remind ourselves that we matter, to people and to God. As Psalm 139 puts it, we are "fearfully and wonderful made. Wonderful are your works...". Each person is God's gift to the world, and it is very healthy for us to remember that fact about ourselves.

Our Church is also a gift to the world. Not just the building, but also the worshipping community that calls this place "home". We want to thank God for our Church, for those who built it and founded it, those who blazed the initial trail, those who have led it over the years, all of the volunteers who have served here; and for everything that God has blessed us with along the way. We thank God for the worship, and for the way that so many Church volunteers have done fantastic service for our community here in Galleywood and beyond.

A birthday is also a time to take stock, to re-evaluate things, and to re-dedicate ourselves to what really matters. And so, the celebrations will remind us that we are the people of God – those who live to worship the Lord, those who have the wonderful Gospel message to share with others, those who love and serve those around us in the name of Jesus. By our lives and words, we proclaim the cross and resurrection of Jesus, and so we proclaim forgiveness of sins and the promise of new life in the here and in the hereafter.

So, our birthday celebrations will help us to look forward to the future with joy in our hearts, knowing that God is with us and that he has good work for us to do. May our 150th birthday be a time of praise, thanksgiving, re-dedication to mission, and joy!
